Day 09. Page – Monument Valley – Gooseneck State Park – Moab (B/D) Hotel in Moab

Today you will drive to the Monument Valley. Monument Valley, meaning valley of the rocks, is a region of the Colorado Plateau characterized by a cluster of vast sandstone buttes, the largest reaching 1,000 ft (300 m) above the valley floor. It is located on the Arizona–Utah border. The valley lies within the territory of the Navajo Nation Reservation. You will also visit the Gooseneck State Park and Mexican Hat. You will stay overnight in Moab, preparing to explore two great national parks nearby.

Day 10. Moab – Grand Arche National Park – Canyonland National Park (B/D) Hotel in Moab

Today you will first go to visit the Canyonland National Park and Deadhorse State Park in the morning. In the afternoon, you will go to explore the Grand Arche National Park.

Day 11. Moab – Salt Lake City (B/D) Hotel in /salt Lake City

After the visit to the Moab. On the way back to Salt Lake City, you will also go to visit the Utah State Park – Goblin State Park. Its eminent feature is its thousands of hoodoos and hoodoo rocks, referred to locally as "goblins", which are formations of mushroom-shaped rock pinnacles, some as high as several meters. The distinct shapes of these rocks come from an erosion-resistant layer of rock atop softer sandstone. Along with Bryce Canyon National Park some 190 miles to the southwest, Goblin Valley State Park is one location with some of the highest occurrences of hoodoos in the world.

Day 12. Salt Lake City – Myrtle Beach by air (B)

Your wonderful tour to the national parks in the west part will soon finish today. Your trip this time visited Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park, Bryce Canyon National Park, Zion Canyon National Park, Glen Canyon National Recreation Area (Lake Powell, Horseshoe Bend and Antelope Canyon) , Monument Valley, Canyonland National Park and Grand Arche National Park; Utah State Parks – Antelope Island State Park, Gooseneck State Park, Deadhorse Valley State Park and Goblin State Park.
